

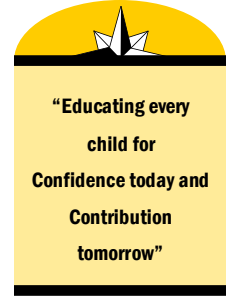

Lake Tapps Elementary educates approximately 490 students. Our students are in grades first, second, and third. We provide a small school setting with comparatively low class sizes. The average class size is approximately 25 students per teacher. Each person on our staff, both certificated and classified, are highly qualified according to federal standards. This means that our certificated staff have at least a bachelor's degree in the area in which they teach. 79% of our teachers have a master's degree and 7 are National Board Certified. Classified staff all have at least two years of college or have passed a test demonstrating basic skills. Our Measurements of Student Progress (MSP) scores for reading and math remain strong, and we continue to make Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP).

Lake Tapps Elementary is proud to report that we have been designated a "Washington Achievement Award Winner" by the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

Our educational program benefits from the Academic Collaboration and Enhancement (ACE) time that is used by staff to plan together, provide staff development, refine curriculum, and communicate with parents. The talents and skills of each student and staff member alike are fostered during this time to maximize learning.

Communication with our community is very important to us. We electronically send home weekly school newsletters; most teachers also send home regular newsletters. School and classroom websites are another way in which we make information available to the community. Several times per year "Your Dieringer Schools" is mailed to all homes within the district.

Lake Tapps Elementary is an inviting place to visit. We have an active parent population that provides support for our school. On any given day you will find a host of parents supporting our students by helping in the library and classrooms, on the playground, and are frequently found enjoying lunch with their children in the multipurpose room. Last year our volunteers logged in over 8,300 hours of help to the students, staff, and school. Countless hours were also given through the PTA.

Each year we develop plans to increase our students' skills to become better readers and mathematicians.

Reading:

Goal: 85% of 1st graders will perform at grade level or above on the Spring STAR Reading Assessment. **Actual: 85.7%**
 Goal: 85% of 2nd graders will perform at grade level or above on the Spring STAR Reading Assessment. **Actual: 85.9%**
 Goal: 85% of 3rd graders will perform at grade level or above on the Spring STAR Reading Assessment. **Actual: 90.1%**

Math:

Goal: 85% of 1st graders will perform at grade level or above on the Spring STAR Math Assessment. **Actual: 91.6%**
 Goal: 85% of 2nd graders will perform at grade level or above on the Spring STAR Math Assessment. **Actual: 87.8%**
 Goal: 85% of 3rd graders will perform at grade level or above on the Spring STAR Math Assessment. **Actual: 98.1%**

AVERAGE DAILY STUDENT ATTENDANCE

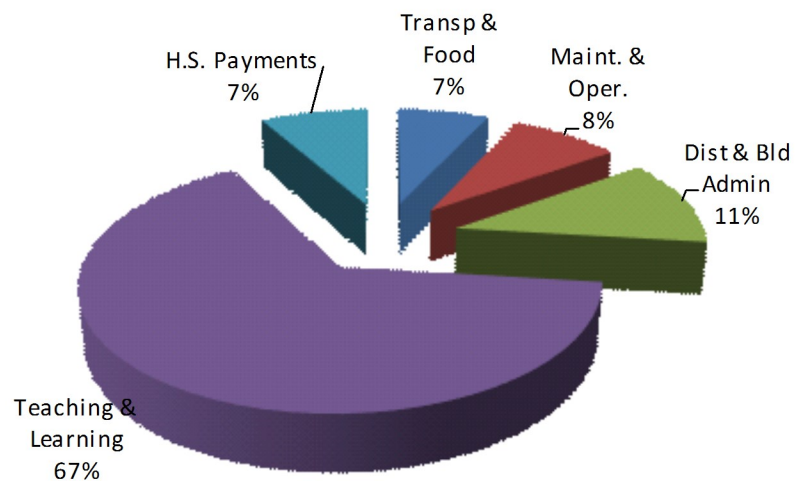


STUDENT:TEACHER RATIO
